

Message from the Rector

In a time marked by profound transitions and increasingly complex global challenges, our University firmly reaffirms its commitment to sustainable, fair, and inclusive growth. Sustainability, in its many dimensions, quides our daily actions as a driver of change, a responsibility toward society, and the education of a conscious citizenry. From this perspective, the university is a place of study and a laboratory for the future - a space where diversity coexists, critical thinking is nurtured, and collective responsibility is promoted. Tor Vergata University of Rome continues to interpret its role with increasing awareness and engagement, contributing to global challenges through concrete and consistent actions. In this spirit, the theme chosen for the inauguration of the 2024/2025 academic vear is: Interconnections and Global Challenges: The Role of Universities. This choice fully reflects our approach: to be a vital hub in a network of academic, social, and cultural relationships, capable of addressing the complexities of the modern world with vision and responsibility. We are aware that today's social challenges are becoming ever more urgent: educational disadvantage, gender disparities, discrimination, migration crises, and psychological vulnerabilities. Social sustainability means educating students who can understand complexity and act with empathy. It means building inclusive communities grounded in listening and cohesion. It also means ensuring that every individual - regardless of their background - can find within this University the tools, connections, and trust needed to shape their future. Alongside this, our commitment to environmental and energy issues remains essential. The climate crisis, biodiversity protection, and a just energy transition are no longer distant scenarios but urgent realities to face with scientific rigor and institutional responsibility. This is why we continue to invest in research, innovation, and educational pathways oriented toward sustainability - so that our University can actively contribute to shaping a more resilient future. In 2024, the University also introduced a strategic tool of collective quidance and commitment: the Green Plan of Tor Vergata, which sets forth principles and guidelines for university action increasingly aligned with environmental and social sustainability goals. Within this vision lies one of the most significant innovations of the 2024/2025 academic year: the launch of the **Degree Program in Veterinary Medicine**. This new program expands our academic offerings and strengthens the University's commitment to an integrated approach to health. The One Health vision - which recognizes the interconnection between human, animal, and environmental health - is now essential in addressing significant global challenges. The course represents a strategic investment aligned with the goals of the 2030 Agenda: Promoting health and well-being (Goal 3), Ensuring food security (Goal 2), Protecting biodiversity and ecosystems (Goal 15). It is a concrete sian of the University's commitment to building a future where the care of life, in all its forms, lies at the heart of sustainable development. By sharing its expertise, Tor Vergata University of Rome embraces both proximity and vision: to be part of the solution, building bridges between disciplines, regions, generations, and cultures. We believe in the value of international cooperation, the power of interdisciplinary research, and the individual's centrality. We believe that we can only build a more just, greener, and more conscious society by bringing together knowledge and action. This is our commitment. With transparency, with passion, with perseverance.

Message from the Pro-Rector for Sustainability

With the eighth edition of the Sustainability Report, the University continues its commitment to monitoring its performance against the goals set out in the 2030 Agenda, At the same time, this document aims to provide students, staff, and the broader public with an integrated overview of the University's management, administrative, educational, research, and third mission activities, highlighting their impact through the lens of sustainable development. The 2024 Report offers a snapshot of a University increasingly committed to sustainability, marked by creating new networks and strengthening existing ones. Performance indicators portray a University that continues to show a steady trend of improvement in environmental, social, and economic sustainability, despite the effects of the international context. There has been a significant increase in research projects and publications on sustainability across various departments over the past two years. Additionally, the educational offering related to sustainability has grown, encompassing undergraduate and graduate degree programs, PhDs, and master's courses, as well as participation rates. The results of the University's commitment to environmental, social, and economic sustainability, as outlined in the Report, are confirmed by notable outcomes in international rankings. In the QS Sustainability Rankings, Tor Vergata University of Rome has placed in the top 18% of universities worldwide, improving from the top 20% the previous year. Furthermore, according to a report by Il Sole 24 Ore, Tor Vergata has been recognized among the Sustainability Leaders 2025, the only university included among the 240 most sustainable companies in Italy. Adopting strategic tools like the Green Plan has spurred a more substantial collective effort, leading to a key milestone: in 2024, the University recorded a 15% reduction in annual carbon emissions (tCO2/eq) related to Scope 1 and 2, compared to 2023. This result is primarily due to the increase in the number of tree and shrub species in the Botanical Garden - approximately 30,000 specimens - and across the broader campus, representing some of the most valuable assets of our University. In 2024, activities to raise awareness and engage students, faculty, technical-administrative staff, and the wider community also increased. Some key initiatives include: Green Food Week, an initiative in collaboration with campus dining services, highlighting the need to reduce the environmental impact of the food supply chain by favoring ingredients that are local, seasonal, and low in water and energy consumption. The goal was to raise awareness within the academic community about making more informed and responsible food choices. The traditional **Sustainable Development Festival**: events focused on the "Green Plan" and were held at the Botanical Garden, with over 100 students in attendance. The topic of energy transition was also addressed. Action for Climate - Climbing for Climate 2024: an excursion to the Velino Springs, near Cittareale (RI), in collaboration with the Italian Alpine Club (CAI) of Rieti and the Alpine Rescue unit of the Finance Police. This immersive experience aimed to raise awareness among approximately 80 participants - including students, faculty, and administrative staff - about the significant reduction in the river's flow and the urgent need for sustainable policies to protect fragile ecosystems.

Tor Vergata University of Rome embraces sustainability in an integrated way across all its functions and activities, to the extent that it has defined its own Vision and Mission in support of sustainable development, aiming to become - through continuous change - an academic center of excellence within the European context. The University is therefore committed to fostering a virtuous cycle that combines the principles of economic, social, environmental, and institutional sustainability with the creation of public and shared value, while also upholding and applying within its sphere of influence the ten principles of the UN Global Compact. The pillars of this integrated system lie in the University's ability to offer high-quality education and conduct cutting-edge research, its commitment to promoting the third mission - engagement and societal impact - and its capacity to attract key stakeholders and build national and international partnerships, including through its membership in the RUS (Network of Universities for Sustainable Development). Equally important are its collaboration with other local development actors and its dedication to creating added value for the communities it serves.

Tor Vergata University of Rome prepares its Sustainability Report annually, in accordance with the GRI Standards and the RUS-GBS Standard and Implementation Manual. This current edition, approved by the Board of Directors during the June 24, 2025 meeting, presents data referring to the 2024/2025 academic year and the 2024 calendar year. It illustrates the journey the University is undertaking - thanks to the full and active involvement of every part of its community - to establish itself as an institution that is attentive, efficient, responsible, and committed to sustainability. To highlight the impact of the actions undertaken, the activities and results described in the following sections are visually marked with icons representing the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the 2030 Agenda, as well as the four thematic areas of the United Nations Global Compact's Ten Principles (human rights, labor, environment, and anti-corruption). This visual system allows each area to clearly reflect the University's specific contribution to the global sustainability goals promoted by the UN.

Education and student services

At Tor Vergata University of Rome, students are at the heart of educational design and operational planning. This is why the University is committed to continuously improving the services it provides, guaranteeing innovative, interdisciplinary academic programs aligned with the principles of sustainability. The goal is to prepare responsible citizens ready to meet the challenges of the professional world.



33,747 enrolled students for the 2024/2025 academic year 42% male and 58% female (+3.76% compared to previous academic year)

Research value and impact

For Tor Vergata University of Rome, research represents the driving force for development and well-being, an engine capable of advancing society along a path of sustainable growth. To this end, the University is committed to applying sustainable development across all disciplinary areas, promoting internal excellence, attracting talent at the national and international levels, fostering joint and collaborative participatory projects, and creating strategic partnerships both nationally and internationally.

The University carries out numerous non-profit initiatives with educational, cultural, and social value, aimed at sharing the benefits of higher education and research.

20 theses on gender issues were recognized with the "Giulia Cecchettin" Thesis Award in its first edition - 12 at the bachelor's level and 8 at the master's level

6 educational initiatives were held at the Botanical Garden to promote environmental sustainability, biodiversity, and social integration.

30 users in average involved in daily green therapy and inclusion activities in collaboration with ASL Roma2 local health services, social cooperatives, foster homes, and day centres in the area

over 30 trees were planted as part of the "Adopt a Tree" initiative

32 sports and cultural events organised by CUS Tor Vergata with 3,678 participants

313 pathways for transversal skills and orientation (PCTO) were activated with 89 schools, involving 6,588 students

















Enhancing and engaging human resources

Working at Tor Vergata University of Rome means being part of an organization where everyone is empowered to contribute to shared goals and express their talent and professionalism. Human capital is the University's greatest strength and competitive advantage in delivering quality services, teaching, and research.

2,348 employees working in various areas of the University, with a 2.5% increase compared to 2022



1,330 faculty members (495 women and 835 men)

University Gender Budgeting and Equality

Tor Vergata University of Rome promotes the affirmation of equal opportunities through measures for the prevention and contrast of gender-based violence. Since 2020, the University has promoted gender equality through the publication of a Gender Budget, which identifies strengths and areas for improvement in achieving gender parity. These insights inform targeted actions. Since 2021, the University has also published a Gender Equality Plan, outlining its internal strategy to foster gender equality and equal opportunities.

Environmental respect and protection

Environmental protection, efficient resource management, and land stewardship are core priorities at Tor Vergata University of Rome.



100% of electricity came from renewable sources, certified by Guarantees of Origin (GO) from GSE

18,761 kWh total electricity consumption (-7.12% compared to 2022, partly due to relamping projects in the Humanities, Engineering, and Economics macro-areas)

1 national inventory of CO2 emissions, prepared according to the RUS Climate Change quidelines for Italian universities, with 2024 data on Scope 1 and Scope 2, calculated using ISPRA and UNFCCC factors

5,847 tCO2eq total emissions, of which 1,442 tCO2eq from direct emissions (Scope 1) and 4,405 tCO₂eq from electricity consumption (Scope 2)

3 projects* to improve the environmental sustainability of the Campus:

- "SEDIA" project introduced 18 eco-friendly (solar charging modules) outdoor benches, which since 2021 are learning and gathering stations across the campus (macro-areas and rectorate)
- · "CARTA" project, an initiative born to promote paper recycling and circular economy awareness with 8 collection points across the campus.
- "GOCCIA" project, an initiative aimed to significantly reduce single-use plastic by encouraging reusable bottles and installing 26 water dispensers across macro-areas in the campus

5 days, during the 2024 Green Food Week, all faculties and macro-areas offered sustainable menus with low environmental impact, inspired by FoodInsider quidelines

83-hectare Botanical Garden available to the university community and the public, which hosts:

- 1 research center active at the Botanical Garden for germplasm conservation aimed at protecting the plant biodiversity of Lazio, safeguarding threatened and endemic species, and preserving ancient and modern cultivars of nutritional and medicinal value
- 1 CO₂ garden for the reduction of greenhouse gas or climate-altering emissions, which, once fully operational, will be able to absorb about 2 tons of CO₂ per year
- · 1 research line on phytoremediation for the natural remediation of contaminated soils and waters, using plant species selected in vitro capable of absorbing, retaining, and degrading pollutants
- 1 photovoltaic system of 6 kW that, since November 2020, allows the University to autonomously produce electricity from renewable sources

Green Plan

Approved in March 2024, the Green Plan is the University's strategic document for ecological transition. Aligned with the 2030 Agenda and the European Green Deal, it defines guidelines, commitments, and operational actions across key areas such as energy,

water, mobility, waste, green procurement, food, and environmental education. Its main goal is to integrate environmental sustainability into all management and organizational decisions through a systemic, measurable, and participatory approach.

Ethical and transparent management, economic sustainability, and performance improvement



Tor Vergata University of Rome plays a leading role in the regional economy, interpreted by the entire University community according to ethics, transparency, accountability, and efficiency principles.

Strategic Performance and "Tor Vergata Public Value" BSC

Since 2022, the University has implemented the "Tor Vergata Public Value" Balanced Scorecard (BSC), a strategic planning and evaluation tool designed to measure the integrated impact of teaching, research, and third mission activities in terms of value

generation for the community. Comprising over 50 indicators, the "Tor Vergata Public Value" BSC monitors resources, efficiency, service quality, and the social, economic, and environmental outcomes of University initiatives, constantly evaluating its progress and impact while guiding its continuous improvement.
